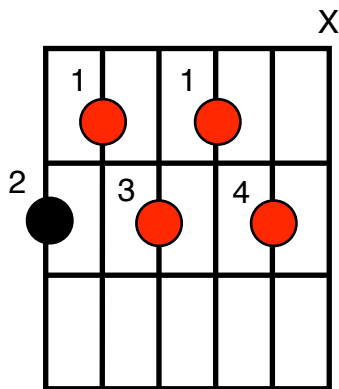

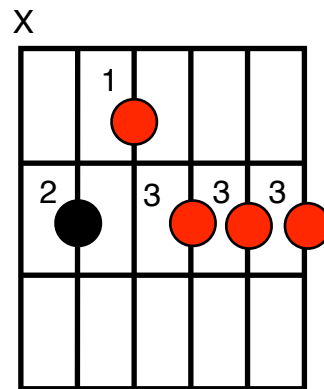
Root Note E String

The chords above are dominant 9 chords, normally written with just the number 9 after the chord letter name, D9, E9 etc. The root note of the chord is shown by the black dot on both the E and A strings. The table below shows the names of the notes at each fret on both the E and A strings. Be sure to mute the strings with the X on.

The chord spelling of a dominant 9 chord is:- 1 3 5 b7 9
