Chords and chord changing can never be practiced too much. However, some chord progressions and changes are very common. It is helpful as a beginner to practice chords that are in the same key as each other, as these will be found together more frequently in songs and certainly in exam chord progressions. Below is a list of the chords learnt so far, in the keys they occur in, try to write some chord progressions of your own. You don't have to use all the chords in every progression.

Chords in C major;

C Cmaj7 Dm Dm7 Em Em7 Fmaj7 G G7 Am Am7

Chords in A minor;

Am Am7 C Cmaj7 Dm Dm7 Em Em7 E7 Fmaj7 G G7

Chords in G major;

G Gmaj7 Am Am7 C Cmaj7 D D7 Em Em7

Chords in E minor;

Em Em7 G Gmaj7 Am Am7 B7 C Cmaj7 D D7

Chords in D major;

D Dmaj7 Em Em7 G Gmaj7 A A7

Chords in A major;

A Amaj7 D Dmaj7 E E7

Blues Chords in E;

E E7 A A7 B7

Blues Chords in A;

A A7 D D7 E E7

These are NOT the only chords found in the keys above, but if you are studying guitar with this web site they are the chords you should be familiar with so far.
